




Installing the CK60 Single Modem Dock

- 1 Place your CK60 single modem dock on a flat, stable, and clean surface within 6 feet (1.83m) of an AC power outlet.
- Connect the power supply to the power connector on the back of your single modem dock. Then connect the power supply to an AC power outlet.
- 3 (Optional) Connect one or more of the following communication cables:
 - RJ11 phone cable
 - Universal Serial Bus (USB) client Type B cable to your PC for ActiveSync support.
 - USB Host Type A cable to a peripheral device such as a keyboard
- 4 Connect the other end of the communication cable to a phone jack.
- 5 Place your CK60 handheld computer in the single modem dock.


Installing the Power Cable Retention Clip

You can use the power cable retention clip to prevent the power cable being disconnected from the single modem dock. To install the power cable retention clip:

- 1 With the CK60 single modem dock positioned so the bottom side is turned to the top, route the power supply cord through the power retention clip and connect it to the power supply connector.
- 2 Attach and tighten the clip screw into the base of the CK60 single modem dock.
